6 **NOTICE OF HEARING**

7 NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a Complaint has been filed pursuant to Chapter 633  
8 of the Nevada Revised Statutes and Chapter 633 of the Nevada Administrative Code,  
9 charging you with various counts of unprofessional conduct, various counts of unethical  
10 conduct, abandoning your patients without making arrangements for their continued medical  
11 care and treatment, failure to provide medical records to your patients, failure to comply with a  
12 Board Order, and based upon an assessment that you are not competent at the current time  
13 to practice osteopathic medicine with reasonable skill and safety due to various  
14 dependencies, which allegations if proven may constitute an unfitness to practice osteopathic  
15 medicine in the State of Nevada.  
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17 **A photocopy of the Complaint and Order for Summary Suspension are being**  
18 **served on you along with this Notice of Hearing.**

19 YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED that a hearing before the Hearing Officer for the  
20 Nevada State Board of Osteopathic Medicine on the complaint shall commence as follows:  
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22 **On May 1 and 2, 2010**, beginning at the hour of 9:00 A.M., or as soon  
23 thereafter as this matter may be heard, and continuing day-by-day thereafter, if necessary, at  
24 the Offices of the Nevada State Board of Osteopathic Medicine, located at 901 American  
25 Pacific, Suite 180, Henderson, Nevada 89014.  
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1 YOU ARE FURTHER NOTIFIED that you have the right to be heard and to appear in  
2 person or by counsel and to present evidence and witnesses on your behalf at the aforesaid  
3 time and place fixed for the hearing on the Complaint and charges.

4 YOU ARE FURTHER NOTIFIED that possible sanctions may be imposed against you  
5 after hearing as authorized in NRS 633.651, namely:

6 1. If the Board finds a person guilty in a disciplinary proceeding, it shall by order  
7 take one or more of the following actions:

8 (a) Place the person on probation for a specified period or until further order of the  
9 Board.

10 (b) Administer to the person a public reprimand.

11 (c) Limit the practice of the person to, or by the exclusion of, one or more specified  
12 branches of osteopathic medicine.

13 (d) Suspend the license of the person to practice osteopathic medicine for a  
14 specified period or until further order of the Board.

15 (e) Revoke the license of the person to practice osteopathic medicine.

16 (f) Impose a fine not to exceed \$5,000 for each violation.

17 (g) Require supervision of the practice of the person.

18 (h) Require the person to perform community service without compensation.

19 (i) Require the person to complete any training or educational requirements  
20 specified by the Board.

21 (j) Require the person to participate in a program to correct alcohol or drug  
22 dependence or any other impairment.

23 The order of the Board may contain any other terms, provisions or conditions as the  
24 Board deems proper and which are not inconsistent with law.

25 YOU ARE ALSO NOTIFIED that, pursuant to NAC 633.460, you and/or your attorney  
26 shall meet or confer with the Hearing Officer or the Hearing Officer's legal counsel, and the  
27 prosecuting attorney for the Board, not later than 20 days before the hearing and exchange  
28 copies of all documents that each party intends to offer as evidence in support of its case,  
identify describe or produce all tangible things, other than documents, that each party intends  
to offer as evidence in support of its case and, if requested, arrange for the opposing party to  
inspect, copy, test, or sample such evidence under reasonable supervision, and exchange  
written lists of persons that each party intends to call as witnesses in support of its case as  
outlined in NAC 633.460 (1)(c).

LASTLY, YOU ARE NOTIFIED that your failure to attend the hearing, or your failure to

1 defend yourself, shall not serve to delay or void the proceedings pursuant to NRS 622A.350.  
2 Pursuant to NRS 622A.410, if your medical license is revoked, an order may be entered by  
3 the Hearing Officer "prescribing [a period of time] in which [you] may not apply for  
4 reinstatement of the license. The period must not be less than 1 year and not more than 10  
5 years."
